Theological | Academic Learning

Students enrolled in LPI will be developed theologically through assigned readings, lectures, tests, assignments, and book discussions.



Relational | Ministry Coaching

LPI is a cohort-based approach to learning in which each student will be responsible to connect with an assigned ministry mentor throughout each semester.



Practical | Ministry Experience

Right theology is designed to inform right practice. Students enrolled in LPI will be challenged to integrate their coursework in everyday life through ministry practice and guided field experiences.

What is the enrollment process?
